Mette Knudsen



Mette Knudsen is currently Executive Director on the Board of the African Development Bank, representing Denmark, Finland, India, Ireland, Norway, and Sweden. She previously served as the Deputy Special Representative of the Secretary General for political affairs (DSRSG/P) in UNAMA, the UN mission in Afghanistan. She has also been Denmark's Ambassador to Afghanistan to Kenya, to Somalia, to Eritrea and to the Seychelles. Earlier in her career she served as Danish Ambassador to Greece and Cyprus, Ethiopia and the African Union and ECOWAS. She was head of the Africa Department in the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and has also had postings in Zambia and Tanzania.

Jayne Musumba



Jayne Musumba is a Division Manager with the Independent Development Evaluation (IDEV) of the African Development Bank, leading a team on knowledge management (KM), outreach, and capacity development. Previously, she was a Principal KM Officer with IDEV. She led the development and implementation of the KM strategy of IDEV and managed the Evaluation Capacity Development program. Prior to joining the Bank, she worked for the United Nations in New York in different capacities as a KM Specialist with UNDP, and as a Sustainable Development Officer with the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN/DESA).

Armand Nzeyimana is the interim Director for the Development Impact and Results Department and Division Manager of the Delivery Support and Implementation Division of the African Development Bank. 
